ITINERARY

JUN 23/Day 1: Transatlantic Flight

We will be departing from US Airport for an overnight flight to Moscow.

JUN 24/Day 2: Moscow (embarkation)

Welcome to Moscow, the Capital of Russia and the crossroads of its people. It abounds in modern boulevards and parks, but is also home of over 800 monuments of Russian history and world culture. Upon arrival the group will be met by our escort and transferred, by private motor coach, to our ship, your floating hotel anchored in the historic Volga River. Time permitting, we will have a short orientation tour of the city before our embarkation and welcome dinner at the boat. (D)

JUN 25/Day 3: Moscow

After breakfast we will have a sightseeing tour of Moscow, which will include the Red Square with St. Basil's Cathedral, the Lenin Mausoleum, Bolshoi Theater; the Olympic Stadium and many other points of interest. While in Moscow, you may visit (optional tour) Pushkin Fine Arts Museum or the Tretyakov Art Gallery, reopened after several years of remodeling project, or attend theater or world famous Moscow Circus. (B,L,D)



JUN 26/Day 4: Moscow

After breakfast we will continue with our sightseeing tour, which will include the Cathedrals Square, the sites of the coronation of the Czars, and Palaces of the Kremlin, the political seat of Russia. (B,L,D)

JUN 27/Day 5: Uglich

We will sail via the Moscow Channel to Uglich, a beautiful little town on the shores of the Volga River. It is known for the impressive Cathedral of the Resurrection and St. John's Church. It is also noted for the Church of St. Dimitri-of-the-Blood, erected where Tsarevitch Dimitri, was murdered in 1591. (B,L,D)



JUN 28/Day 6: Yaroslavl

Founded in 1010 by Grand Prince Yaroslav the Wise, the city stretches for miles along the confluence of Volga and Kotorosl rivers. Developed in the 16th and 17th centuries, as the Volga's first commercial port, Yaroslavl was also the center of an independent principality. City's merchants, prosperous from the Middle East and European trade, competed to build churches bigger than Moscow's. Their legacy-majestic 17th century cathedrals, unique merchant churches, remnants of an ancient trading center, and Yaroslavl's spectacular historic and architectural sights will transform your visit into remarkable experience. We will tour the city by bus, tour the ground of Transfiguration monastery and visit to the church of Elijah the Prophet. (B,L,D)

JUN 29/Day 7: Goritsy/ Kirilo-Belozersky Monastery

After passing White Lake you will enter the Volga-Baltic Canal and Goritsy, a village known for the Kirilo-Belozersky Monastery founded in 1397. It is surrounded by fortress walls, crowned with magnificent towers, and decorated with brick patterns. It also has one of the best

collections of Russian Icons in the World. The group is taken to the site by bus. (B, L,D)

JUN 30/Day 8: Kizhi Island

The state architectural, historical and ethnographical museum of the Kizhi Island is a unique collection of Russian wooden architecture. It is said that the 22 domes of the Preobrazenskaya Tsercov (Church of the Transfiguration, built in 1714, are made entirely out of wood and without the use of nails. The "Kizhi" museum also includes several chapels located at the mainland and nearby islands. It is, perhaps, the most exquisite example of northern Russian wooden church architecture. This open-air museum of wooden architecture is very close to the pier, within walking distance, so the tourists walk on foot to see the sights. (B,L,D)



JUL 1/Day 9: Arrival in Mandrogi or Svirstroy (Lodeynoe Pole)

This area is located in the middle of the final locks leading to St. Petersburg, following the 139-mile long Svir River. It is sprinkled with dachas (country cottages). Here, you'll discover the intricacies of rural Russian life. Weather permitting, we will have a "green party", near the pier with picnic lunch (barbecue, wine) instead of lunch onboard to the accompaniment of folklore music. (B,L,D)

JUL 2/Day 10: St. Petersburg

Welcome to St. Petersburg, formerly known as Leningrad. This city, built on 101 islands and interconnected by 300 bridges, has been the old capital of Russia and home to some of its mighty Czars. After breakfast we will have a sightseeing tour of St. Petersburg. In the afternoon, we will drive along the Nevsky Prospect with its finest shops, cafes and museums. We will see the Kazan Cathedral with a view down Kanal Griboedovea to the church of our Savior on the Spilled Blood. Pass the Gostiny Dvor (the city's largest department store), the National Library and the monument to Catherine the Great. We will pass by the Peter and Paul Fortress, the final resting place of the Romanov Czars before returning to your cruiseship. (B,L,D)



JUL 3/Day 11: St. Petersburg (Hermitage Museum)

After breakfast we will visit the Palace Square with its Winter Palace now housing the Hermitage Museum, which contains three million exhibits and early collections dating back to Catherine II. One of the famous collections is Rembrandt's The Return of the Prodigal Son. You will find the rooms containing Russian and Oriental arts. (B,L,D)

JUL 4/Day 12: St. Petersburg

Free day for shopping, optional tours, ballet, or concerts (B,L,D)

JUL 5/Day 13: St. Petersburg/ USA

Last Day of your unforgettable Russian cruise. After morning breakfast you'll be transferred to the airport for your flight to USA. (B)

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
